NEW! Arts and Crafts Series

At the end of the 19th Century, the Arts and Crafts Movement was the predominant art movement internationally. Its origins trace back to England in 1861, when artist William Morris founded Morris, Marshall, Faulkner and Co., a decorative arts firm that specialized in handmade wallpaper and fabrics, hand-woven tapestries and other interior décor. Morris' daughter May was in charge of needlework. In 1872 the Royal School of Art Needlework was started to address the problems of art education for women in England. Today, the school survives as the Royal School of Needlework at Hampton Court Palace and one of its graduates teaches at Filoli.

In the United States the Arts and Crafts Movement formed later, but had the same impact on the arts. In San Francisco a group, including Filoli designers Willis Polk and Bruce Porter, formed the first Arts and Crafts Society in the United States in 1894. This influence can be clearly seen in Porter's stained-glass designs and Polk's commission for the Bourn's Webster Street house. Today, Filoli celebrates this Arts and Crafts Movement heritage by introducing a new series of classes for these traditional crafts.

Embroidery is the art of decorating fabric with a needle and thread or yarn. Its age of origin is unknown, but examples survive from Ancient Egypt, Iron Age Northern Europe and Zhou Dynasty China. Using kits designed by the instructor, students create individual pieces using a different technique in each workshop. These classes require no experience but can also be useful for an accomplished embroiderer to brush up on techniques.

Introduction to Botanical Art

BOTANICAL ART CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

The Filoli Botanical Art Certificate Program offers a unique, in-depth study of botanical art through challenging, integrated and comprehensive courses. The curriculum includes the systematic study of artistic skills and concepts, basic botany and botanical art history. A certificate will be presented upon successful completion of course work (180 classroom hours plus homework) and presentation of a portfolio and final project. Enrollment in the certificate program is not necessary to participate in these classes; however, prerequisites must be completed. Drawing Plants in Perspective I

This foundation course teaches students to draw accurately plants by observing basic botanical shapes and structures and illustrating them in great detail with botanical accuracy. Each of the five sessions focuses on one shape to emphasize and develop observation and foreshortening skills. Students learn to interpret hidden edges to achieve a believable drawing and work on shading skills through value contrast to create three-dimensional shapes. Students enrolled in the Certificate Program are given homework assignments in each session.

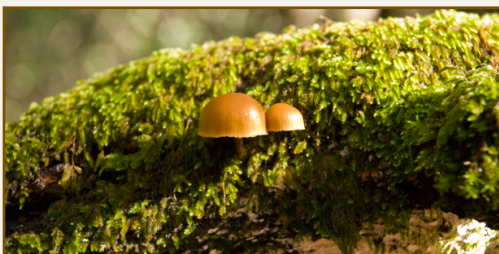
Ikebana

Ikebana (Japanese flower arranging) is noted for perfect proportions and dramatic use of negative space. The world's top floral designers recognize that a command of ikebana design principles results in better, more sculptural design work. In this four-lesson course, students will be introduced to basic patterns created in both moribana (flat, shallow) and nageire (tall, cylinder) containers. During each lesson there will be demonstration/lecture, hands-on design by students and critique. Returning students are encouraged; individual curriculum will be given.
