Syrie Maugham:

Staging the Glamorous Interior

Thursday, September 22, 2:00 pm-3:00 pm

Presenter: Pauline Metcalf

Trendsetter, fashion icon, wife of an internationally-renowned writer and playwright, interior designer Syrie Maugham created an ultra-chic world that was as unique as it was influential. Her ethereal all-white rooms of the 1920s and 1930s were echoed in high-style interiors around the world and translated into movie sets and theatrical productions. Pauline Metcalf celebrates the work of this legendary British designer's dramatic life and meteoric career that included commissions in the United States from Palm Beach, Florida to Hillsborough, California and on the continent by clients ranging from British royals and European aristocrats to American socialites and Broadway stars. Pauline Metcalf will take you on a lively transatlantic voyage through Maugham's world. A reception, book sale and signing will immediately follow the presentation.

Golden Gate Park:

San Francisco's Urban Oasis

Presenter: Christopher Pollock

San Francisco's Golden Gate Park covers 1,017 acres, larger than New York City's Central Park, and is home to botanical gardens, museums, open space and even a bison herd. Its creation was a challenge -- in the decades after the Gold Rush, San Francisco was envisioning the transformation of itself from a rough frontier town into a metropolitan center with open public spaces. New York had Central Park and in the 1860s the people of San Francisco began to dream of their own grand public park. In 1870, engineer William Hammond Hall started work with a preliminary design in hand. The chosen land consisted of wind-swept, ocean-sprayed sand dunes. He started the process of reclaiming the site by finding plants that would stabilize the soil and survive the harsh conditions. By 1879, only nine years after the initial plan and design, Golden Gate Park had been transformed from barren dunes to a young forest with more than 155,000 trees. Author and historian Christopher Pollock shares the stories and historical accounts alongside an expansive collection of early photographs that will take you back and help you discover, all over again, the wonder of San Francisco's Golden Gate Park. A reception, book sale and signing will immediately follow the presentation.

It became the rage in 18th-century England when botanical artist Mary Delany created elaborate paper artwork cutouts (découpage) that were used to decorate furniture. Today, objects like small boxes and trays are decorated with cutouts from magazines, wrapping paper, greeting cards or other print designs. Discover the techniques of découpage as you create your own project to take home.

Botanical Art Certificate Program

This Filoli Botanical Art Certificate Program offers a unique in-depth study of botanical art through challenging, integrated and comprehensive courses. The curriculum includes the systematic study of artistic skills and concepts, basic botany and botanical art history. A certificate of completion will be presented upon successful completion of course work (180 classroom hours plus homework) and presentation of a portfolio and final project.



Enrollment in the certificate program is not necessary to participate in these classes; however, prerequisites must be completed.

Pen and Ink

The basics of pen-and-ink techniques are taught through an engaging curriculum of lectures, demonstrations and hands-on exercises. Begin your studies with a historical overview of pen and ink followed by a demonstration of the basic techniques and creation of a tone scale with stippling technique and line drawing. Continue your studies on day two through technique exercises, including hatch and crosshatch. On day three you will learn texture techniques

while selecting a variety of subjects and making 3 small drawings.
